



VET AT THE CIRCULAR HEAD TRADE TRAINING CENTRE

Smithton High School's Southside campus includes the Montagu Road Campus of the Circular Head Trade Training Centre. Working with a range of Registered Training Organisations (RTO's), the CHTTC (together with its partner campus at the Circular Head Christian School) offers a selection of accredited training in full qualifications and skill sets. Delivery may be face-to-face, on-line, or utilising a combination of both. All offerings are subject to numbers.

Vocational Education and Training (VET) programs place a strong emphasis on employability skills including communication, teamwork, problem solving, using initiative and enterprise skills, planning and organising, self-management, a commitment to learning and the use of technology.

The industry standard workshops at the CHTTC provide for training in Construction, Automotive, and Engineering at Certificate II level. Each of these programs is offered across two years with students gaining a Statement of Attainment in selected units at the end of Year 1 and the full qualification at the end of the second year.

The Hospitality program presents an opportunity for students to gain one or both qualifications at the Certificate II level. The Certificate II in Hospitality and the Certificate II in Kitchen Operations are taught together as a 300 hour program across the course of the year. At Southside the Hospitality team operates the onsite kitchen/café, the '*Rustic Duck on Montagu*' which is open to the public. Students gain experience in front of house service and kitchen operations depending on their work preference.

The CHTTC also offers students the opportunity to gain the Certificate II in Business and/or Certificate II in Tourism. Offered as a 150 or 300 hour program across the year, units are clustered for delivery to ensure students have the best chance of achieving both Business and Tourism qualifications. Students complete written course work utilising our online training and assessment resources. Assessment is flexible and may be adjusted to meet individual student needs where they are able to negotiate a work placement within the business, tourism, or community services sectors.

The CHTTC partners with Foundation Education to offer the Certificate II in Sport and Recreation in an online environment. The qualification allows learners to develop knowledge and skills for work in the sport or recreation industry in roles such as providing support in delivering sport and recreation programs, ground and facilities maintenance, retail, customer service assistance and administrative assistance in fitness centres, outdoor sporting grounds or complexes, or aquatic facilities.
